



The above listed organizations urge your support of SB 1771 (Sher) when it is heard on the Senate Floor today. SB 1771 creates the California Climate Action Registry, a voluntary program that supports entities to:

- ξ Make economically beneficial improvements in energy efficiency and subsequent reductions in emissions of greenhouse gases; and to

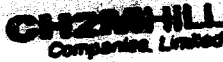

Dear Governor Davis,

I am writing to you in support of SB 1771, the California Climate Action Registry. I am the Director of Environmental Affairs for worldwide operations for the Dole Food Company, the world's largest producer and marketer of fresh fruit and vegetables and one of California's largest agricultural companies. As a general rule, my company follows the guidance of the Western Growers Association on legislative matters relating to agriculture. However, since the WGA has not taken a position on SB 1771, I am writing to express my personal support for SB 1771, recognizing that this may or may not be the position of the majority of the members of the Board of Directors or the Officers of the Dole Food Company.

Senate Bill No. 1771 appears to offer farming operations an opportunity to take credit for actions designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions while imposing few (if any) additional costs. Indeed, if improvements in energy efficiency are as cost-effective as experts believe, SB 1771 could result in savings, not only for traditional industrial operations, but for agricultural operations as well. Dole has first-hand experience with the benefits of energy efficiency. Recently, Dole received an incentive payment from Southern California Edison of over \$20,000 for our efforts to implement energy efficient design features in our headquarters building in Westlake Village, California. In addition, SCE awarded Dole over \$100,000 credit toward its utility bill.

Dole is also considering utilizing waste-to-energy technology to manage its residuals from farming and food processing (e.g. salad production). It would be to Dole's benefit to have the resulting reduction in energy usage reflected in a state inventory.

The burden on the agricultural community of this bill appears to be small. The program is voluntary - hence, companies can participate or not, as they see fit. The costs arise in the development of the inventory, in the actions taken to reduce emissions of greenhouse gases and through purchasing the services of a third party auditor. Therefore, I would urge the legislature to take the steps necessary to


ensure that sufficient technical assistance is available along with low-cost consulting services, so that agricultural operations, already faced with an uncertain economic forecast, would be able to inventory their emissions without increasing costs.

As the improvements in energy efficiency are reported to have relatively high rates of return, companies may find that it is in their interest to participate in the program. However, I would encourage the implementing authority to track information on the economic benefits of reducing greenhouse gas emissions. The information could potentially be a valuable incentive to get others to participate in the program, and it could serve to help quantify the benefits of energy efficiency.

I urge you to take a leadership role nationally on the issue of energy efficiency and sign SB 1771.
